




EndItNow® – Standing Against Abuse

Central Jamaica Hosts First EndItNow Summit – August 17–23, 2025

The Central Jamaica Conference, in collaboration with the Portmore Zone of churches, hosted its inaugural **EndItNow Summit** at Braeton SDA Church under the theme “*Restoring Honour Across Generations: Honouring the Elderly, Ending Abuse.*” The week began with a **Wellness Retreat** spearheaded by Brigette Lindsay, Juanita Gooden, and other Women’s Ministries leaders, where the elderly was pampered with massages, hair care, and special gifts, alongside guidance and encouragement from Mrs. Kerryan Witter of UWI.

Across the Conference, Women’s Ministries leaders carried out care package distributions, community outreach, and awareness campaigns using social media and public testimonies. Sabbath presentations featured **Dr. Gombele** and a heartfelt keynote by **Dr. Lorraine Vernal**, emphasizing the dignity and value of the elderly. In Manchester, the Mandeville SDA Church concluded the week with healing prayer services and an **Elderly Spa Day** for over 30 participants, and branded aprons and reusable shopping bags were distributed in the market to keep the **EndItNow** message alive year-round—reinforcing that it is more than a one-day event, but a call to honor and protect every life.


